Description

Nevil Maskelyne was the fifth Astronomer Royal at Greenwich, from 1765 to his death, and a Commissioner of Longitude. His first achievement at Greenwich was to establish regular publication of the Nautical Almanac. This was first issued in 1766 and disseminated the astronomical tables essential for accurate navigation, especially finding longitude by lunar distances.
