

The Queen's House

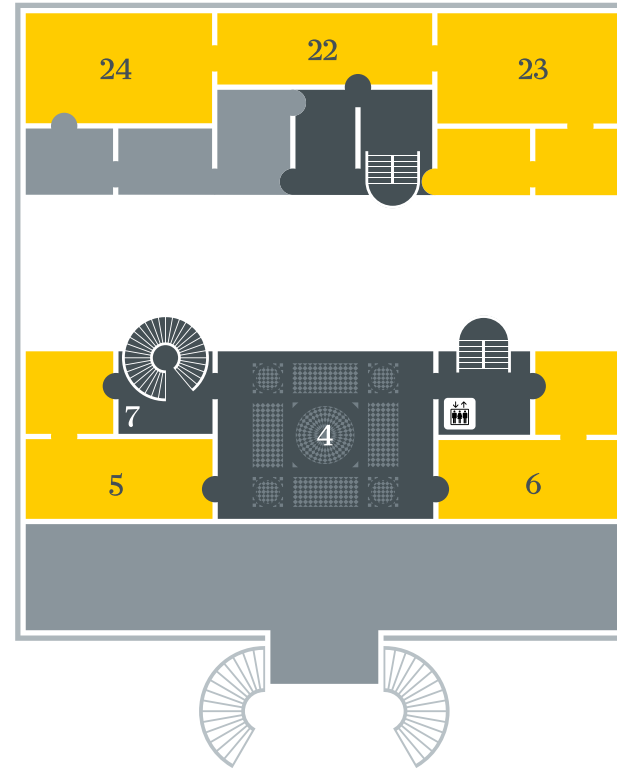
This beautiful royal palace completed for Charles I's queen, Henrietta Maria, features the National Maritime Museum's world-class collection of paintings.

Built between 1616 and 1638 as England's first truly classical building, Inigo Jones's Palladian masterpiece features the elegant Tulip Stairs and the awe-inspiring Great Hall, a perfect 40 foot cube.

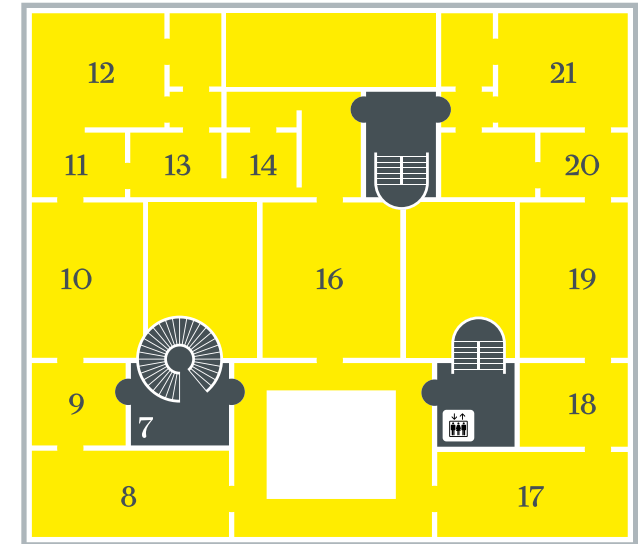
Use this floor map to plan your visit. Architectural and audio guides are available at the information desk to enhance your visit.



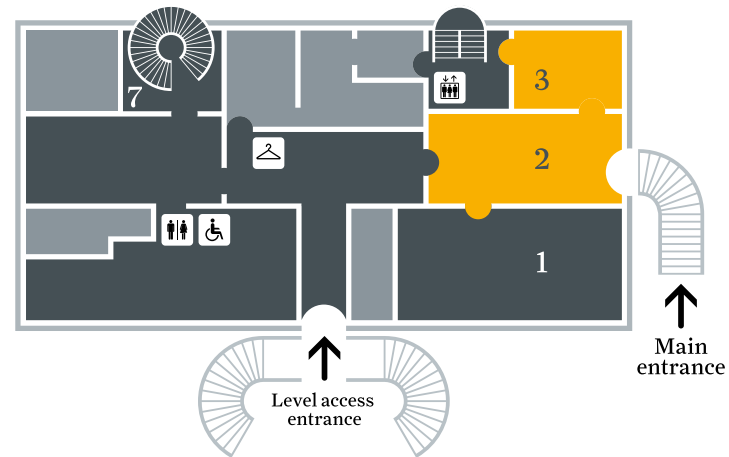
Floor one
