Group leader: to ensure that everyone has an enjoyable and safe visit on board, please read through the following points with your group:

During you visit

- Students must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times.
- Adults are responsible for their group and their group's behaviour at all times in all areas.
- Keep bags and belongings on you at all times. All belongings are the responsibility of their owners.
- Explore the ship in small groups, and start on different levels.
- Be aware of other visitors when exploring the ship and walk on the left hand side of staircases.
- Listen to any requests made by staff.
- Help us to preserve this iconic vessel by treating her with care and respect.

Access

- Cutty Sark is a Victorian clipper ship with original features which may trip you up. Please watch your footing and look out for low beams.
- The main deck of the ship can be slippery when it rains. Take care and bring appropriate clothing in case you get caught in a storm!
- All levels of the ship are fully wheelchair accessible, but due to the ship's historic nature some areas of the main deck are not accessible to wheelchair users. Virtual access is provided to these spaces.
