Description

This is a Spanish 'milled' dollar. The edges have been patterned or 'milled' to stop silver being shaved from them, which would reduce their value. Spanish dollars were known as 'pieces-of-eight' because each one was worth eight *reales* – a common smaller Spanish coin.
