Through objects and artworks we can learn about ours and other people's journeys.









Economic migration – when people move to create a better life for themselves






Refugee

Someone who is forced to leave their country because of war, natural disasters or persecution.


'I can't live in Afghanistan because there's bomb blasts there and it's dangerous.'





Asylum Seeker

Someone who is forced to leave their country because it is not safe and travels to another country hoping that the government will protect them and allow them to live there.
