What do you already know about travel across the sea? Have you seen the sea?

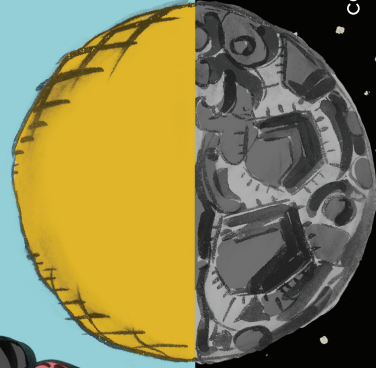
Can you see any seafarers from the past here on the Great Map?
