Outline of the role

Royal Museums Greenwich is looking for a facilitator to assist and deliver on our storytelling focused EYFS, KS1 and KS2 programmes. The post holder will deliver sessions for a range of primary aged formal learners in *Cutty Sark*, the Queen's House and the National Maritime Museum. This will involve preparing resources, setting-up for sessions and delivering workshops. You will also be asked to contribute to devising new programmes and carry out other school-related duties as required.

Our schools primary programs aim to excite children about heritage, history and the arts, covering a range of topics and cross-curricular themes. There will be opportunities participate in the Early Years family program as well.
