You can use this guide to help you choose what you want to see and do at the National Maritime Museum. This is the National Maritime Museum in Greenwich.




You can enter the Museum from the park side.


There are lots of things to see and do at the Museum.

The Museum closes at 5:00pm.

It also means there is a suggested route in place through the galleries.




When you come inside, you will pass the visitor toilets. There are also other toilets around the Museum.




There is also a changing places facility at the Museum.

When you arrive you can pick up a trail from the Play and Explore trolley to help you explore the galleries!




To go to the galleries, we recommend going through the tunnel.




My Greenwich
