

## **Legacies of Transatlantic Enslavement Video Resources**

## 'How do the legacies of Transatlantic Enslavement impact people and their identities today?'

These videos have been created to support students and teachers studying the histories of Transatlantic Slavery. They consider modern-day legacies of Transatlantic enslavement and how people have responded to them.

Each video is made up of interviews with a range of participants and addresses a particular theme. There is a discussion question to consider for each video. These themes (and their discussion questions) are:

- Money and Public Spaces (How should our museums and public places represent the histories of Transatlantic Slavery?)
- Migration and Communities (How do shared histories connect different people and communities?)
- Racism and Inequalities (How are people challenging racism and inequality today?)
- Education and Activism (What and how should people learn about the history of Transatlantic Slavery? How do you think people should respond to this today?)
- Lifestyle and Culture (How does learning about other people and the past change how we understand the lives of people today?)

Students can watch the videos together and discuss the question posed by each or investigate videos separately and then share their thoughts on the videos. Once they have done this then can use this information to discuss and answer the overall question at the top of this page.

They can use the sheet overleaf to collect information and answer the overall question.
