About the project

Royal Museums Greenwich (RMG) explores our relationship with the sea, space, and Britain's role in world history. At the National Maritime Museum (NMM), we use RMG's collections to create accessible, welcoming spaces for young people. Our <u>Saturday Art Club</u> - part of the <u>National Saturday Club</u> <u>Network</u> - is a free weekly creative workshop for 13–16-year-olds in Greenwich. It offers the chance to try new techniques, visit other cultural venues, and build new social connections in the local area. Our members often share difficult experiences with their mental health – they said the club helps them feel less isolated, creates a sense of belonging, and is a place to process their feelings creatively.

The Museum is seeking a kind, organised, and child-centred Assistant Facilitator, to support the 2025-6 Saturday Art Club. The Assistant Facilitator will work closely with the Lead Facilitator to support all aspects of workshop delivery. This includes set up and take down, organising materials, supporting the registration and safe release of club members at the start and end of workshops, including contacting guardians when needed. The Assistant Facilitator will work directly with young people at art club to support them to take part and build relationships with other members, including providing additional support for young people with learning or access support needs and/or disabilities.

We would like to work with someone who understands, or is enthusiastic to learn more about, how to identify and respond to safeguarding disclosures and concerns. The Assistant Facilitator is required to attend some trips away from the NMM to other culture venues, as arranged by the Youth Programme Producer. We ask you're available for the whole project to develop good working relationships with club members.

This entry-level, supporting role would suit someone looking to gain paid experience working with young people in the cultural sector, as an assistant creative facilitator and/or youth worker. Closely supported by the RMG Youth Producer through regular communication and termly debriefs, this role is aimed at giving paid development opportunities to people aged 18-30. If you haven't done a role like this before, transferable skills from public facing, voluntary, community, or customer service roles are relevant and valuable.

- Understanding barriers that can prevent young people from accessing creative activities and museums.
- Comfortable working in a team both collaboratively and taking direction.
- An interest in arts/culture and supporting young people to experience art in different ways.
- Holder of Enhanced DBS issued within last 3 months/consenting to RMG completing one.

Desirable

- Some experience in a range of 2D and 3D artistic practices e.g. photography, textile, sculpture, painting, printing, sketching, collaging, etc.
- Some experience of using visual arts to interpret collections and histories.
- Some experience of assisting artists/facilitators in workshops or learning environments.
