# About the project

Royal Museums Greenwich (RMG) explores our relationship with the sea, space, and Britain's role in world history. At the National Maritime Museum (NMM), we use RMG's collections to create accessible, welcoming spaces for young people. Our <u>Saturday Art Club</u> - part of the <u>National Saturday Club</u> <u>Network</u> - is a free weekly creative workshop for 13–16-year-olds in Greenwich. It offers the chance to try new techniques, visit other cultural venues, and build new social connections in the local area. Our members often share difficult experiences with their mental health – they said the club helps them feel less isolated, creates a sense of belonging, and is a place to process their feelings creatively.

The Museum is seeking a skilled, kind, and child centred artist-facilitator to lead the 2025-2026 Saturday Art Club. The Lead Facilitator will design and deliver the weekly workshops for a group of 20 young people aged 13-16. We'd like these workshops to cover a diverse range of 2D and 3D art forms and be inspired by themes and objects from RMG's collections. Members' interests and passions should also guide the content of workshops, and the Lead Facilitator is required to consult with members' and collect feedback to do this.

The Lead Facilitator will work closely with participating club members to create a comfortable and welcoming space by ensuring their lived experiences are valued and respected. We are looking for an artist-facilitator with robust, practical understanding of how to identify and respond to safeguarding disclosures and concerns, including those related to young people's mental health.

As the Lead Facilitator you will attend some trips away from the NMM to other culture venues, as arranged by the Youth Programme Producer, and presented by the National club, including a temporary exhibition in July 2026. As we also offer Bronze or Silver Arts Award, you will also ensure the programme equips members to achieve their Arts Award, including documenting and moderating their work in a portfolio.

We ask you're available for the whole project to develop good working relationships with members. This role is closely supported by an assistant facilitator, and throughout the academic year by the Youth Programme Producer through regular communications and termly debriefs. Training is provided.

- Demonstratable experience working with young people aged 13-18 years in a museum, gallery or other arts, community and/or cultural setting.
- Robust practical understanding and previous experience of how to identify and respond to safeguarding disclosures and concerns, including those related to young people's mental health.
- Confident in a range of 2D and 3D artistic practices e.g. photography, textile, sculpture, painting, printing, sketching, collaging, etc.
- Experienced in planning and delivering inclusive creative participatory activities for young people, and young people with learning and access support needs and/or disabilities.
- Committed to working in a child-centred way by adapting workshops to be guided by young people's interests and ideas recognising the diversity of their lived experiences, interests and support needs.
- Understanding barriers that can prevent young people from accessing creative activities and museums.
- Holder of Enhanced DBS issued within last 3 months/consenting to RMG completing one.

- Previous experience/training as a Bronze or Silver Arts Award Advisor.
- Experience of using visual arts to interpret collections and histories in heritage settings.
- Youth Mental Health First Aid Training.
