Overview of the session

Introduction

Learners are introduced to what Cutty Sark is and when it sailed.

Storytelling Activity

With song, dance, and drama, learners take part in a retelling of Robert Burns' poem *Tam O' Shanter* and uncover how Nannie the Witch became *Cutty Sark's* figurehead.

Figurehead Activity

Learners examine the figurehead display, deciding which one is their favourite. They are encouraged to think about what figurehead they'd want on their own ship.

Ship Exploration

As a class, learners explore the ship using one of our self-guided Story Ship trails.



Suggested pre visit knowledge/activities	Suggested post visit activities
Know what a cargo ship is. Show London, China and Australia on a map and introduce the idea that people once sailed there to trade things like tea. Explain how <i>Cutty Sark</i> is now a landmark in London.	Learners can make their own figurehead with the craft kit supplied. We encourage schools to continue to build vocabulary through fun movement, themed actions and commands/ship-related verbs and roles. Play a game: Captain Says (like Simon Says) Captain says: hoist the sails! Captain says: sip your tea!
