I will arrive at the National Maritime Museum.



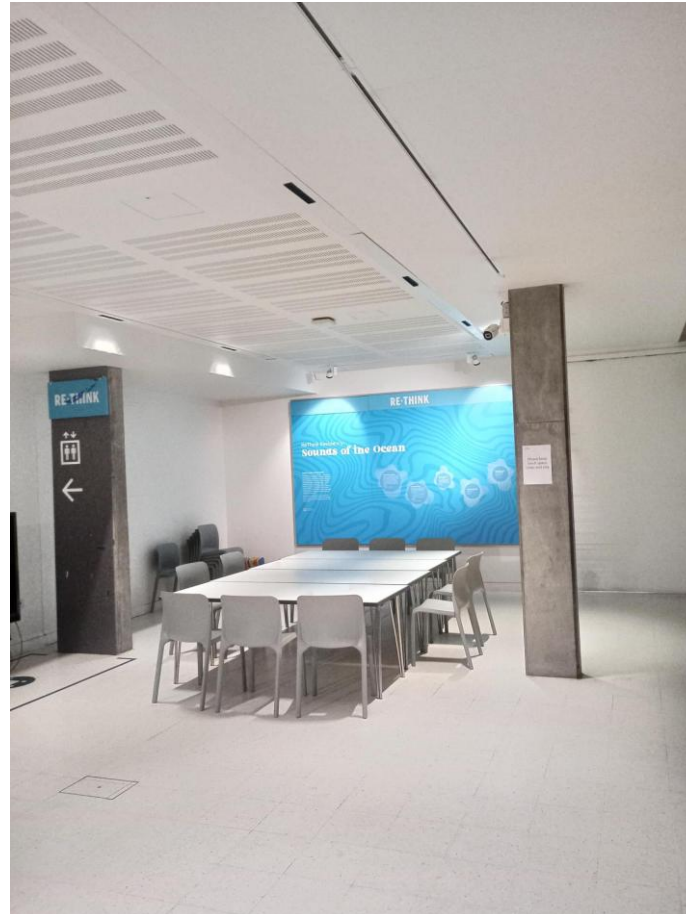
The people in blue uniforms work here.
They are happy to help!



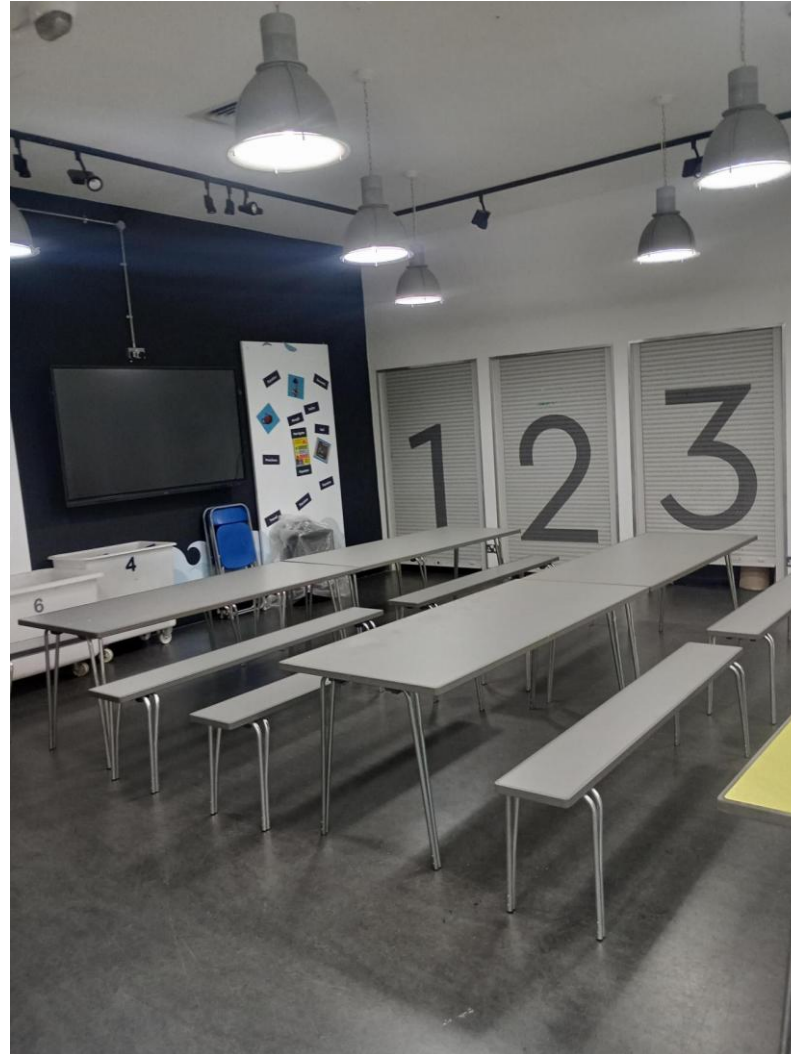
There are toilets on the ground floor of the museum.

There are weighted lap pads, noise cancelling headphones and fidget toys if I want to use them.

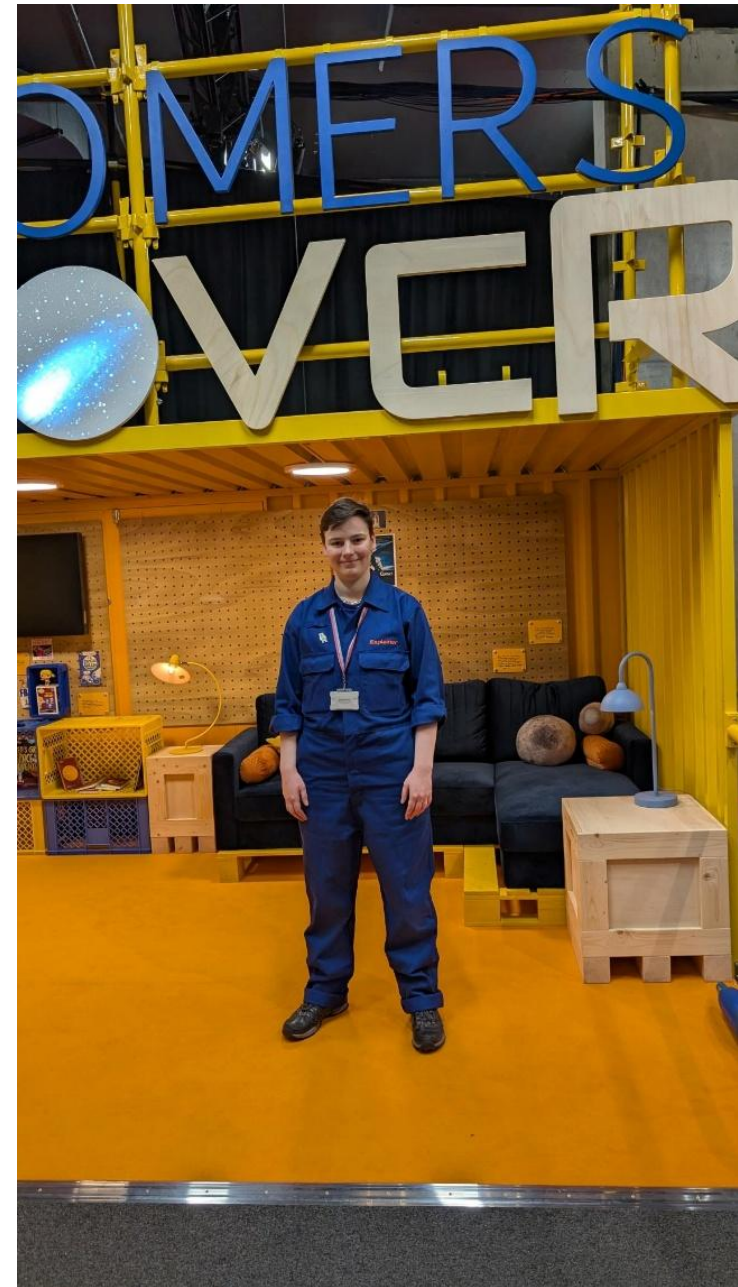


I will go to the 'Astronomers Take Over' exhibition.
