Curriculum Links:	Drama, Geography, History, Literacy, Science, Communication
Session times:	Flexible
Capacity:	5-10 pupils per session

Discovery Map

P Scale:	1-3 and 4-7
Curriculum Links:	Communication, Geography, History, Science, Life Skills
Session times:	Flexible
Capacity:	5-10 pupils per session
Session price:	Free

In this part-facilitated/part-self-guided session, our skilled facilitator will introduce pupils and teachers to our tactile *Discovery Map*. You will use the map to become the captain of your own voyage, exploring the galleries to discover life at sea and in far-off places through touch, smell, sound and sight.

Pupils will:

- enjoy sounds, smells, colours and textures through multi-sensory learning
- explore a Museum environment at their own leisure
- develop independence and learner voice in a social environment



Learning, Living and Working at the Museum

Key stage:	Post-16 SEND (entry levels 1 and 2)
Curriculum Links:	Basic skills for independence, Preparation for work and contribution to society
Session times:	Flexible
Capacity:	5-10 students per session
Session price:	Free

This 3-part programme is designed to enrich life skills for SEND learners aged 16+. Visit the Museum 3 times over 3 weeks to explore how the Museum is a place for learning, living and working.

Students will:

- explore what is in a Museum
- learn how to visit a Museum
- discover who works at a Museum
- experience a taste of working at a Museum
- develop social and communication skills
