Description

These snow shoes were also made by Tlingit tribe members from wood, string and rawhide for the arctic like environment. The Tlingit tribe live all along the Pacific Northwest coast of North America. Lots of snow falls there throughout most of the year. These shoes are very useful for crossing snow because it spreads your weight evenly and means you don't sink into the snow drifts. They were therefore vital for the Tlingit to survive. The shoes would have been just as useful to explorers.
