Session outline Pirate Day

Key Stage 1

This fun, exciting day immerses children in the world of pirates long ago and provides them with the inspiration they need to write creative stories set on the high seas. A variety of activities are timetabled for classes throughout the day, each lasting approx. 45 minutes.

Meet a female pirate: aboy there me hearties! Learn to walk and talk like a pirate at the Pirate Academy. Children meet our friendly pirate actorcharacter and participate in fun activities such as singing a pirate song and designing their own Jolly Roger.

All Hands interactive gallery session: scrub the decks and fire the cannon! A hands-on session designed especially for young pirates. Guided by a Visitor Assistant, children explore the interactive exhibits in the children's gallery to gain a deeper understanding of what life was like onboard ship in the age of sail.

Pirate treasure trail: self-directed time exploring the galleries to find treasures to add to children's own treasure chests. Children sketch the objects they find onto a net of a pirate treasure chest which can then be folded and stuck together back at school to create a 3D chest to fill with children's own treasures.

The day runs from 10.15 until 14.00 and a detailed timetable with timings for each activity and a 12.30 lunch slot will be handed out on the day of your visit.
