

Description

At about 4 a.m, early on 7 September 1838, the steamer *Forfarshire*, bound for Dundee, struck rocks near the Longstone Lighthouse (Farne Islands) and broke in two. She sank immediately and only nine people escaped the wreck. Grace Darling and her father, the lighthouse keeper, rowed a boat to the rocks in heavy seas and saved the survivors in a remarkable and famous rescue.
