Description

This Victorian painting shows a girl and two boys hauling a wrecked ship's figurehead ashore using ropes and a boat hook. The title of the painting suggests the children think the wooden figurehead could be a mermaid. Their innocent play contrasts with the wild and dangerous sea crashing against the rocks.

Hook was a well-known seascape painter during the Victorian period and was noted for painting family scenes of fishing communities in Devon and Cornwall.
