Cutty Sark is the world's sole surviving tea clipper, the speed machine of her time and living testimony to the bygone, glorious days of sail. Built in 1869 to carry tea back from China, she visited nearly every major port in the world during the course of her career and gained fame for her record-breaking passages through the wildest oceans around the globe. Designed to last just 30 years and now nearly five times that age, *Cutty Sark* has been painstakingly conserved and lifted by over three metres, allowing you to explore her decks and gaze up underneath her hull in an immersive experience that brings her fascinating history to life.

Must see...

- **Cutty Sark introduced**
Watch a short film in the lower hold to learn more about the ship and her past.
- **The Main Deck**
Marvel at the towering masts and miles of rigging above you, take the helm at the ship's wheel, and enjoy fabulous views of the river.
- **Underneath the hull**
Walk right underneath this huge 963-ton ship, with its gleaming hull, and touch a piece of history.
- **Captain's cabin and crew quarters**
Experience what life was really like at sea for the crew and the captain in his saloon.
- **For families**
Meet a character from the past, follow a trail or get creative in family workshops over the first weekend of each month and school holidays.

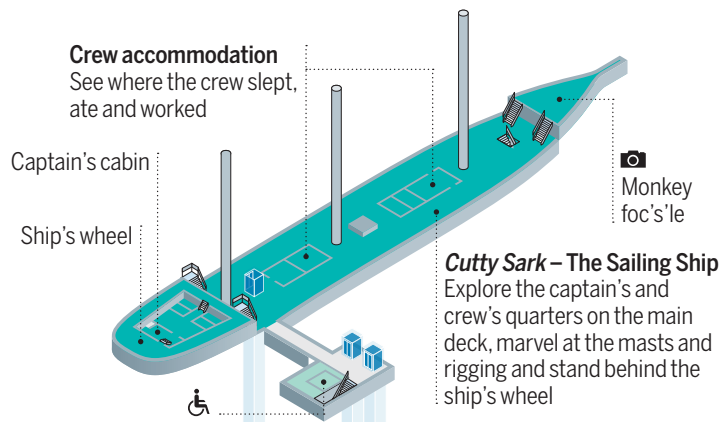

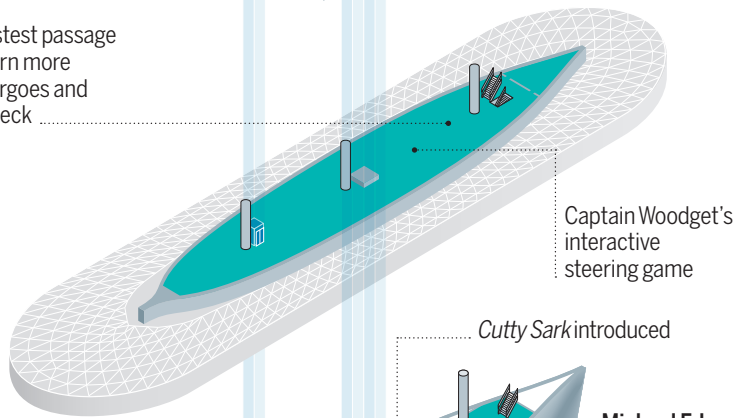

Level 2: Main Deck



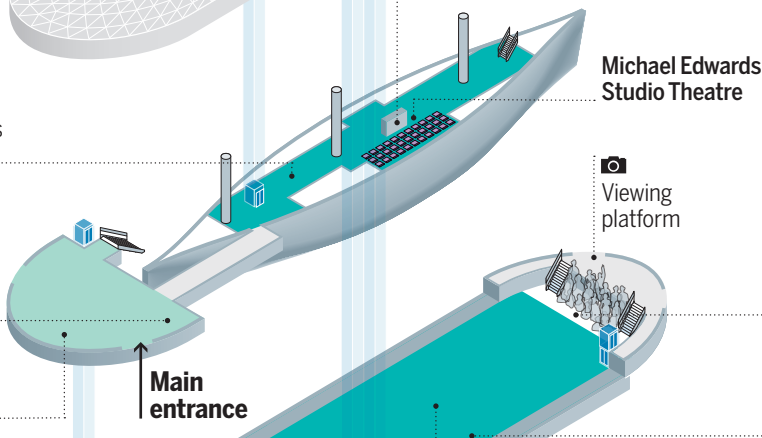
Cutty Sark – The Voyager
